Summer Band Camp Info



As time quickly approaches for the start of band Camp, we thought it might be a good idea to review some “basics” to make this a more enjoyable experience.

- Bring and drink water, lots of water, at least 2 liters daily in a refillable container
- Wear light colored, loose fitting clothing
- Wear a wide brimmed hat
- Use sunscreen, SPF 30 or higher
- Bring lunch/dinner, in a small cooler; track meal schedules as they may change daily
- Bring your own medication (i.e.; prescription meds, inhalers, insulin, etc.)
- Wear comfortable shoes
- Wear sunglasses (yeah, you get to look cool)
- DON'T FORGET YOUR DOT BOOK
- Get plenty of rest at night...go to bed early
- Bring your instrument
- Bring your music
- Eat a good, healthy breakfast

***REPORT ON TIME!!!!**

Plan to arrive on campus **AT LEAST 15 MINUTES EARLY**. All students must be on the field at scheduled call time. If you are late, **YOU WILL BE RUNNING!!!!** All scheduled absences and late arrivals **MUST** be cleared with Mr. Stone in writing, 48 hours prior to.

***IMPORTANT: The Ayala BAC, Ayala High School, CVUSD or anyone associated with these entities cannot be held responsible for the loss and/or damage to personal property left unattended by your student while attending rehearsals or participating in any BAC activity. Personal property, other than what is required to rehearse or perform, should be left at home. These shall include, but are not limited to, I-Pods, cameras, laptops, gaming devices, cell phones, wallets, and purses.**

.....One last thing about water; proper hydration should begin, prior to the start of practice. Drink at least a pint of water, 1 hour before rehearsals begin!

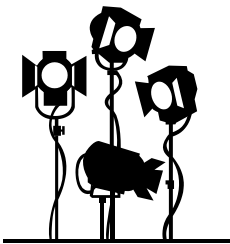
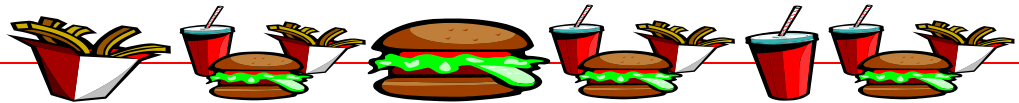
Hospitality Corner

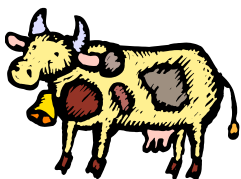

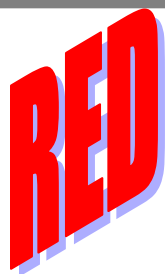

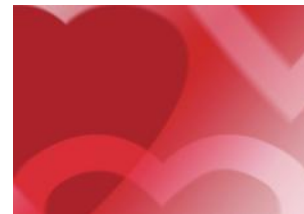
